

Reviewer:

The statement "Many employers make fatal mistakes..." is too broad. Consider softening the language or backing it with empirical support or citation.

The discussion transitions from the benefits of coaching to why it is underused in Iran. A clearer transition sentence is needed to maintain logical flow between ideas.

This paragraph integrates multiple findings from different studies. For coherence, consider presenting each study in its own sentence or bullet-style format to clarify distinct contributions.

The explanation of SEM concepts (direct, indirect effects) seems overly didactic for a results section. Consider relocating this content to the methodology section or an appendix.

The initial paragraph of the discussion largely repeats the abstract. Please revise to focus instead on interpreting the empirical results in light of the literature.

The sentence "...several researchers have obtained valuable and effective results" is vague. Name each researcher clearly before discussing their specific findings to enhance readability.
